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Studies in Rhetorics and Feminisms

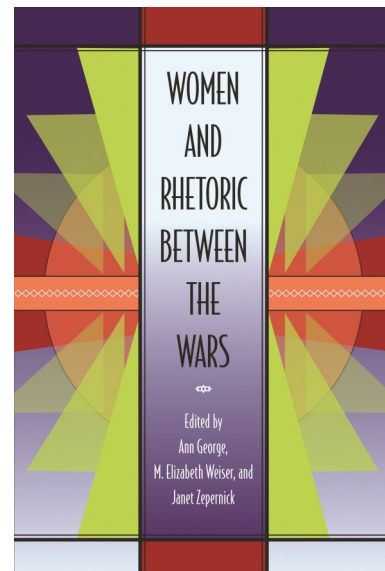

This interdisciplinarity has already begun to transform the rhetorical tradition as we have known it (upperclass, antagonistic, public, spoken, and always male) into re-gendered, inclusionary rhetorics (democratic, dialogic, collaborative, private, and sometimes unspoken). Our cultural, political, and intellectual advancements depend upon such a balance.

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
